- The Certified County Tax Roll for Okeechobee County is \$2,317,904,998.00. This is an increase from the previous year of \$219,284,570.00 or 10.45%. For millage purposes, 96% of the certified tax roll is used which is \$2,225,188,798.00, an increase of \$210,513,187.00.
- The Required Local Effort millage is set by the state at 3.839, a decrease of 0.272 mills from last year, and is expected to generate \$8,542,500.00 which is an increase of \$260,169.00.

- The maximum Discretionary Local Effort millage rate of 0.748 is also set by the state and is expected to generate \$1,664,441.00, an increase of \$157,464.00. Levying this Local Effort millage makes the District eligible to receive Millage Compression funding from the state.

Superintendent Kenworthy reviewed the following millage information:

- Total FEFP revenue is expected to be \$32,173,917.00, an increase of \$1,176,644 compared to last year's budget. The total number of students (FTE) this year is expected to increase by 139.80. The weighted FTE for 2019-20 is projected to increase to 6851.27.
- The Base Student Allocation (BSA) for the state increased by \$75.05 to \$4,279.49 for the upcoming school year. Okeechobee's District Cost Differential (DCD), although increasing this year to .9781, is still less than 1.000. Therefore, after applying the District's DCD to the state BSA, the District's BSA is \$4,185.77 rather than the full amount of \$4,279.49.
- The Operating General Fund Budget is \$58,695,948, an increase of \$3,876,532.
- The Debt Service Budget is \$21,551, a decrease of (\$17,931).
- The Capital Projects Budget is \$7,313,875, an increase of \$881,789.
- The Food Service Budget is \$5,381,847, an increase of \$1,067,155.

- It is expected that the total Federal Through State revenue will be \$532,331, a decrease of (\$231,193).
- The total State FEFP, Lottery, and Categorical funding is estimated at \$38,952,720 which is an increase of \$1,227,922 over last year's budget.
- The total State Funds expected are \$39,451,906, an increase of \$796,807.
- The total for all revenue sources is \$51,389,486, an increase of \$1,009,038 over last year's budget.
- This year's Cost Center appropriations are \$40,806,245. Appropriations for State and Local Projects totals \$11,851,789. Total Appropriations are estimated to be \$52,658,034.
- Total Appropriations combined with Projects and Categoricals Forward, and Encumbrances Forward, produces an estimated ending fund balance is \$5,370,165.
- The Total Appropriations & Balances equals the Total Revenues at \$58,695,948.
- The Debt Service Budget is \$21,551 which is equal to the Debt Service Revenue plus the Beginning Fund Balance.
- The Capital Projects Revenue is \$3,444,783. With the inclusion of Fund Balances Forward, Reserves, and Encumbrances, the Capital Budget for 2019-20 is \$7,313,875.
