# First Grade Reading Camp

# Environmental Exploration Camp

This environmental science-themed 2 week project-based learning program will focus on literacy in science and critical thinking skills. Students will conduct field research at various locations in and around the Okeechobee area. While in the classroom, students will learn about these environments while improving their reading skills. This program will focus on the environment, succession, consumption, and waste management. Throughout the course of our time together, participants will visit locations to determine how they function, the diversity of life within them, what humans can get from it, how environments change when man becomes involved, restoration, and water quality. Possible locations to visit include Fort Pierce Inlet Park, Indian River Lagoon, Tampa Aquarium, Kissimmee River Preserve, Archbold State Park, and Highlands Hammock. Local areas will include Waste Management, a local farm, and City Hall.

#### Camp Thrive

Life is 10% what happens to us and 90% how we react to it. Regulation is something everyone continually works on whether or not we are cognizant of it. We all encounter trying circumstances that test our limits from time to time. If we are able to recognize when we are becoming less regulated, we are able to do something about it to manage our feelings and get ourselves to a healthy place. This comes more naturally for some, but for others it is a skill that needs more attention and practice. This is the goal of The

Zones of Regulation curriculum which will be taught during Camp Thrive. In addition, Tykes and Teens counselors will hold small groups (with parent permission) to provide targeted support in topic areas such as coping skills, self-esteem, social skills, self-acceptance, anger management, inclusion, and diversity.

# Employability Skills Camp

# 4th grade Math Camp

This math camp is specifically designed to serve children currently in fourth grade. It reinforces mathematics lessons children learned while attending school throughout the year and helps them "leapfrog" so that they are better prepared for more advanced mathematics in the next school year. ### SAT/ACT Prep

# Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK)

Florida's Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program or VPK is a free educational program that prepares 4-year-olds for kindergarten and beyond. Children must live in Florida and be 4 on or before September 1. Some 5-year olds are also eligible, depending on their birth date. The 2021 Summer Program consists of 200 instructional hours. If your child attended a school year VPK program, he/she is NOT eligible for the summer VPK program unless extreme hardship applies. **Transportation will not be provided.** 

### **Enrollment Requirements:**

Parents must complete a VPK application online by clicking on the <u>Florida VPK</u> link here.

- Upload or bring the child's original birth certificate and immunization record signed by a physician <u>and</u>
- Upload or bring Proof of Florida Residency (e.g. electric bill, lease, driver's license, or pay stub with address)

**Who:** Children must live in Florida and be 4 on or before September 1. Some 5-year olds are also eligible, depending on their birth date.
