**Re:** ESE Requirements for Renewal of Professional Educator Certificates

## Facts to Know:

- Anyone renewing a **Florida professional certificate after July 2014** will be required to meet the certification requirements as outlined by the Florida Department of Education office of Certification Renewal: <a href="http://www.fldoe.org/teaching/certification/fl-educator-certification-renewal-requ.stml">http://www.fldoe.org/teaching/certification/fl-educator-certification-renewal-requ.stml</a>. This will not add to the total already required (six semester hours/120 inservice credits.)
- No one is exempt from meeting the requirement. It does not matter your certification, position or degree.
- It does not apply to District Vocational, Career and Tech, adult education and substitute certificates that are awarded by the district.
- A passing score on the Florida Subject Area Exam in Exceptional Student Education, Hearing Impaired, Visually Impaired or Speech Impaired <u>can be used</u> provided it was taken during the validity period of the professional certificate being renewed.
- In current legislation, the requirement to earn this ESE requirement must be completed within each renewal period of the Florida Professional Certificate. *It is NOT a one-time requirement.*

## Okeechobee Procedures:

- College courses that address instruction of students with disabilities or note differentiated instruction may be considered acceptable. A college transcript noting successful completion must be submitted to the Staff Development Office for approval. This course must have been taken during the renewal period.
- Currently, the Professional Development is accepting courses from FDLRS PDA Modules (Florida Diagnostic and Learning Resources System- Professional Development Alternatives) as options for the 20-hour requirement. These courses meet the requirement of *addressing instruction of students with disabilities*. (Gifted courses do not meet this requirement.) - <a href="http://pdportal.florida-ese.org/descriptions.aspx">http://pdportal.florida-ese.org/descriptions.aspx</a> also provides an additional course for Fine Arts teachers that can meet this requirement. \*
- Each PDA course provides a different number of credits dependent upon the time to complete the coursework. Even though a teacher only needs the 20 hours, he or she may take any of the other courses to increase points for recertification <u>and</u> satisfy the 20 hour requirement.
- Teaching Students with Disabilities is a 20 hour independent Study that will meet this requirement and can be taken at any time.
- With any course completion, the Professional Development office will need the certificate to note completion for in-service credit.
