	Malissa Morgan Chairman Holcomb read the recommendation. Superintendent Kenworthy stated that one item on the recommendation had a correction and an additional statement was added. Attorney Conely stated that Kimberley Nunez submitted a Request to Address the School Board. Chairman Holcomb invited Ms. Nunez to the podium and explained that she would have five minutes to address this Agenda item. Ms. Nunez explained her former positions prior to becoming a classroom teacher at North Elementary School. Ms. Nunez stated that on December 22, she met with Principal Robinson who released her as a probationary employee, effective that day. Ms. Nunez explained that she had an evaluation a week earlier and received a note for doing a good job. She further explained some of her summative results and questioned why she was terminated, she stated it may be personal. Ms. Nunez has since received several forms from the District showing different termination dates. Ms. Nunez said that she did not receive an exit interview and that her insurance ended on January 1, 2018, with no option to extend. She requested a copy of her personnel file, it was delayed due to second floor construction. Ms. Nunez shared copies of documents with Board members. Chairman Holcomb said that she was sorry for the confusion and that the District should do a better job for exiting staff. Superintendent Kenworthy explained that Director of Human Resources, Sherry Wise, is drafting a document to assist staff as they exit the District. Member Ball has concern with the evaluation and note, described by Ms. Nunez, and that she was not given an opportunity to learn about concerns ahead of time to change behaviors or address issues. Member Morgan stated that the mid-year evaluation has four domains and asked Ms. Nunez said that She. Robinson stated during the summative meeting that they needed to work better together, and that she was a new teacher and you learn as you go. Member Morgan asked if the other position developed.

- A. <u>SUPERINTENDENT</u>

- D. <u>PUBLIC</u> -
  - The following residents of Berman Road completed a Request to Address the School Board form. Chairman Holcomb invited each resident to speak and reminded them of the five minute limit.
    - Ashley Tripp Stated that this was her first Board meeting and that she was impressed with the process. Ms. Tripp applauded the District for recognizing Ag, rodeo, and Career and Technical Education. She stated that she has lived on Berman Road for nine years and has concerns with the increasing truck traffic, the speed in which the trucks travel on a road zoned residential/Ag and for student and bus safety. Ashley shared incidents involving trucks, speed and recklessness as well as near-miss incidents involving trucks and school buses. She expressed concern for students waiting at bus stops along Berman Road. Some students are picked up while it is still dark by the bus. Ms. Tripp met with County Commissioners in an attempt to solve the problem before there is a tragedy. Ms. Tripp asked the Board to ask Commissioners to increase law enforcement: Sheriff, FHP and DOT and to ticket drivers and increase patrol. She encouraged all parties to come to the table for a solution and include Waste Management.
    - Andre Walther A resident of Berman Road for three years and a law enforcement officer for Palm Beach County. Mr. Walther shared examples of incidents and close calls with trucks and school buses on Berman Rd. He asked that the Board get FHP/DOT involved and to ask for enforcement of the speed limit.
    - Holly Walther A resident of Berman Rd. discussed her concerns for the safety of students and buses on Berman Rd. Discussed possible side road options for bus stops. Ms. Walther said there are thirty-six stops/3 tiers each day on Berman Rd.
    - Katie Walther A Berman Rd. resident and student, stated that trucks do not slow down and rarely stop for buses. Member Morgan asked if we should reroute until we can do something. The Superintendent said the District would check on the accessibility of side roads along Berman Rd. and reach out to the Sheriff, FHP and DOT. Member Morgan suggested speaking with Waste Management regarding the trucks and asked if a deputy with flashing lights could accompany Berman Rd. buses.
