III. Request to Address the Board

Dr. Christopher Robshaw addressed the Board regarding an abstinence policy. His presentation included the following points:

- Children are passing infections among themselves, especially sexually transmitted diseases among teenagers. Dr. Robshaw stated that he is concerned that kids are not getting the information they need to avoid transmission of infections and diseases. The number of reported cases of sexually transmitted infections (STI's) in a community is always less than the true number of infected individuals because some people never get tested or do not have symptoms.
- The current abstinence only policy has been shown in many studies to be completely ineffective and likely to increase sexually transmitted diseases as well as pregnancy. Teen pregnancy affects their potential for the future and contributes to a repeating cycle of poverty.
- According to the Center for Disease Control (CDC), 5% of children are sexually active by the time they turn 13 years old, half of all kids start having sex by the time they turn 17, and 70% are sexually active by the time they turn 19 years of age. By the time they reach 12th grade, 20-25% of teens have had four or more partners, and 50% have had sex in the last three months as of 2013. Dr. Robshaw stated that he believes the children in this community are at least at the national average or above when it comes to sexual activity. Dr. Robshaw provided data on the numbers of STI's reported in the last year for teens in Okeechobee.
- So far as teen pregnancy, Dr. Robshaw reported that in 2012 (the latest available data) Okeechobee County had a live birth rate of 47.7 per 1,000 for 14-18 year olds. This is more than twice the state average.
- Dr. Robshaw stated that abstinence only education programs have been tried and studied for years. According to the data, abstinence only programs are not working. He reported that age appropriate, comprehensive, sexual health education programs (that also include abstinence only) have been studied and proven to delay teens initiating sex and increase the chances for using protections and contraceptive methods.

- In 2013, the Florida Department of Education started pilot programs in five counties, including St. Lucie County, to develop programs in Florida. Models are now available for other counties to use.
- Dr. Robshaw asked that the School Board adopt a policy of comprehensive sexual health that will provide age-appropriate information on abstinence, STI's, pregnancy, and disease prevention. Dr. Robshaw offered to assist and be a part of a workgroup if the Board so desires.
- The Board asked Superintendent Kenworthy to investigate programs that may be available to the school system from the Florida Department of Education and other school districts.

IV. Public Hearing

- The Certified County Tax Roll for Okeechobee County is \$1,685,662,603.00. This is an increase from the previous year of \$90,612,121.00 or 5.7%. For millage purposes, 96% of the certified tax roll is used which is \$1,618,236,099.00, an increase of \$86,987,636.00.
- The Required Local Effort millage is set by the state at 4.954, a decrease of 0.189 mills from last year, and is expected to generate \$8,016,742.00 which is an increase of \$141,531.00.
- The maximum Discretionary Local Effort millage rate of 0.748 is also set by the state and is expected to generate \$1,210,441.00, an increase of \$65,067.00. Levying this Local Effort millage makes the District eligible to receive Millage Compression funding from the state which this year will be approximately \$1.5 million.
- The Capital Improvement Effort millage is unchanged from last year at 1.50 mills and is expected to yield an estimated \$2,427,354.00, an increase of \$130,481.00.
- The total local tax receipts for the Operating Fund are expected to be \$9,227,183.00, and increase of \$206,598.00 over last year's receipts. The total combined tax receipts, including Capital Improvement, are \$11,654,537.00 which is an increase of \$337,079.00 from last year.

Superintendent Kenworthy reviewed the following millage information:

- Total FEFP revenue is expected to be \$28,714,050.00, an increase of \$805,906.00 over last year's budget. The total number of students (FTE) this year is expected to increase by 19, and the projections have been met at this point. The weighted FTE for 2015-16 is projected to decrease slightly to 6,673.08.
- The Base Student Allocation (BSA) for the state increased by \$122.68 to \$4,154.45 for the upcoming school year. Okeechobee's District Cost Differential (DCD), although increasing this year by .0035, is still less than 1.000. Therefore, after applying the District's DCD to the state BSA, the District's BSA is \$4,030.65 rather than the full amount of \$4,154.45.

- The Operating General Fund Budget is \$53,494,160.96, an increase of \$998,264.47.
- The Debt Service Budget is \$202,953.55, a decrease of \$22,238.41.
- The Capital Projects Budget is \$3,912,224.84, and increase of \$484,353.82.
- The Food Service Budget is \$4,343,836.88, and increase of \$178,357.86.
- The Federal Programs Budget is \$5,631,153.06, and increase of \$99,406.02.
- The Total Budget is \$67,584,329.29, and increase of \$1,738,143.76.
- It is expected that the total Federal Through State revenue will be \$358,500.00, a decrease of \$48,022.11.
- The total State FEFP, Lottery, and Categorical funding is estimated at \$28,714,050 which is an increase of \$1,125,126.00 over last year's amended budget.
- The total State Funds expected are \$35,766,818.05, an increase of \$920,963.90.
- The total for all revenue sources is \$47,401,809.15, an increase of \$1,215,739.80 over last year's amended budget.
- This year's Cost Center appropriations are \$40,878,678.00. Appropriations for State and Local Projects totals \$9,629,026.57. Total Appropriations are estimated to be \$50,507,704.57.
- Total Appropriations combined with Projects and Categoricals Forward, and Encumbrances Forward, produces an estimated ending fund balance is \$2,671,489.57.
- The Total Appropriations & Balances equals the Total Revenues at \$53,494,160.96.
- The Debt Service Budget is \$202,953.55 which is equal to the Debt Service Revenue plus the Beginning Fund Balance.
- The Capital Projects Revenue is \$2,486,354.00. With the inclusion of Fund Balances Forward, Reserves, and Encumbrances, the Capital Budget for 2015-16 is \$3,912,224.84.
- The bus fleet is relatively young, and the Board has a policy that states it will not have a bus on the road over 15 years old. Therefore, to sustain the fleet's age through a possible encumbrance of capital funds during an OHS rebuild, buses must be purchased now while the District has full use of its capital funds. There are also some major projects that will be completed before beginning the OHS rebuild such as asphalting, roofing, HVAC repairs/replacements, and SREF-initiated projects.
- Some capital funds will be transferred, as in past years, to cover liability insurance and maintenance costs.
- The total Food Service budget is \$4,343,836.88.
- The total budget for Federal Programs is \$5,631,153.06.
- The total budget for 2015-16 is \$67,584,329.29, an increase of \$1,738,143.76 over last year's total budget.

	 Dr. Watson provided the Board with a Procedural Checklist for Special Facilities Construction as well as a letter from the Office of Educational Facilities regarding their determination after reviewing the District's Castaldi Analysis. The surveys are basically asking to remove all students from the Freshman Campus and move them to Okeechobee High School and then to replace the buildings at OHS while at the same time maintaining classes. A full survey will not be due until June of next year.

	 The Special Facilities project will be based on 1,773 student stations and the capacity of the rebuilt school will be 1,684 students. Student enrollment is a moving target; however, if enrollment exceeds that number in five years following completion, another spot survey could be completed to raise the student capacity. The final price tag for the Special Facilities project should be approximately \$62.8 million. This would be the largest project that Special Facilities has ever funded. The next step, after spot survey approval, is for the Superintendent to send a letter to the Florida Department of Education requesting a site visit. The mission of a 5-member team would be to determine if the project is the most critical need in the District. It is expected that proviso language or possibly statute will be in place requiring a pledge of 0.75 mills of capital funds for the project rather than the full 1.5 mills of capital outlay tax receipts. The District will be required to hire an architectural firm after the Special Facilities committee determines that the project is a critical need. The request for funding does not look just at the number of student stations, but takes into consideration the curriculum and all possible needs for classrooms and teaching. The goal is to send the Special Facilities budget request to the 2017 legislative session and begin construction in the 2017-18 school year. It is most likely that the class of 2021 would be the first to graduate from the completed facility.

	The Board discussed possible changes to the grading and the timelines for turning in late work and makeup work. They also discussed late and make-up work for Honors, Advanced Placement, and Dual Enrollment classes.
	After discussion, the Board requested the following language for the Student Progression Plan:
	Late work is defined as work that was not turned in on time even though the student was present when the assignment was due. Late work shall not be granted full credit. For assignments other than homework and practice class work, late Late work shall be accepted for one week day from the due date and the student will receive no less than 50.75% of the earned credit for the assignment. Honors and Advanced Placement courses that have a contract that includes a policy regarding late work will be exempt from the Late Work section of Student Progression. Parents and students will be required to review and sign the contract prior to placement in these courses. Dual Enrollment courses are also exempt from this section and the policies and procedures dictated by the postsecondary institution where they are enrolled will be followed. These procedures will be listed in the syllabus provided to the students at the beginning of each dual enrollment course. This deadline may be extended with the approval of the teacher or principal.
